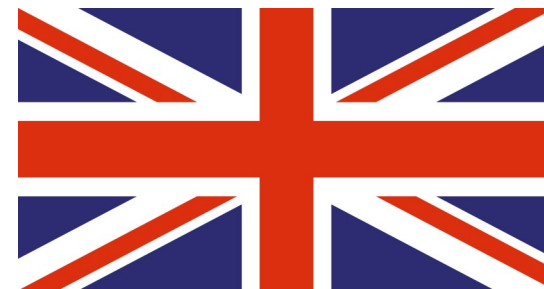





This pack contains 4 different bunting templates, each in two sizes (A5 and A4)

- A 'ready to go' Union flag if you just want to print and string up the bunting or to use as a guide for colouring in your own Union flag bunting
- A VE DAY 75 flag for you to colour in

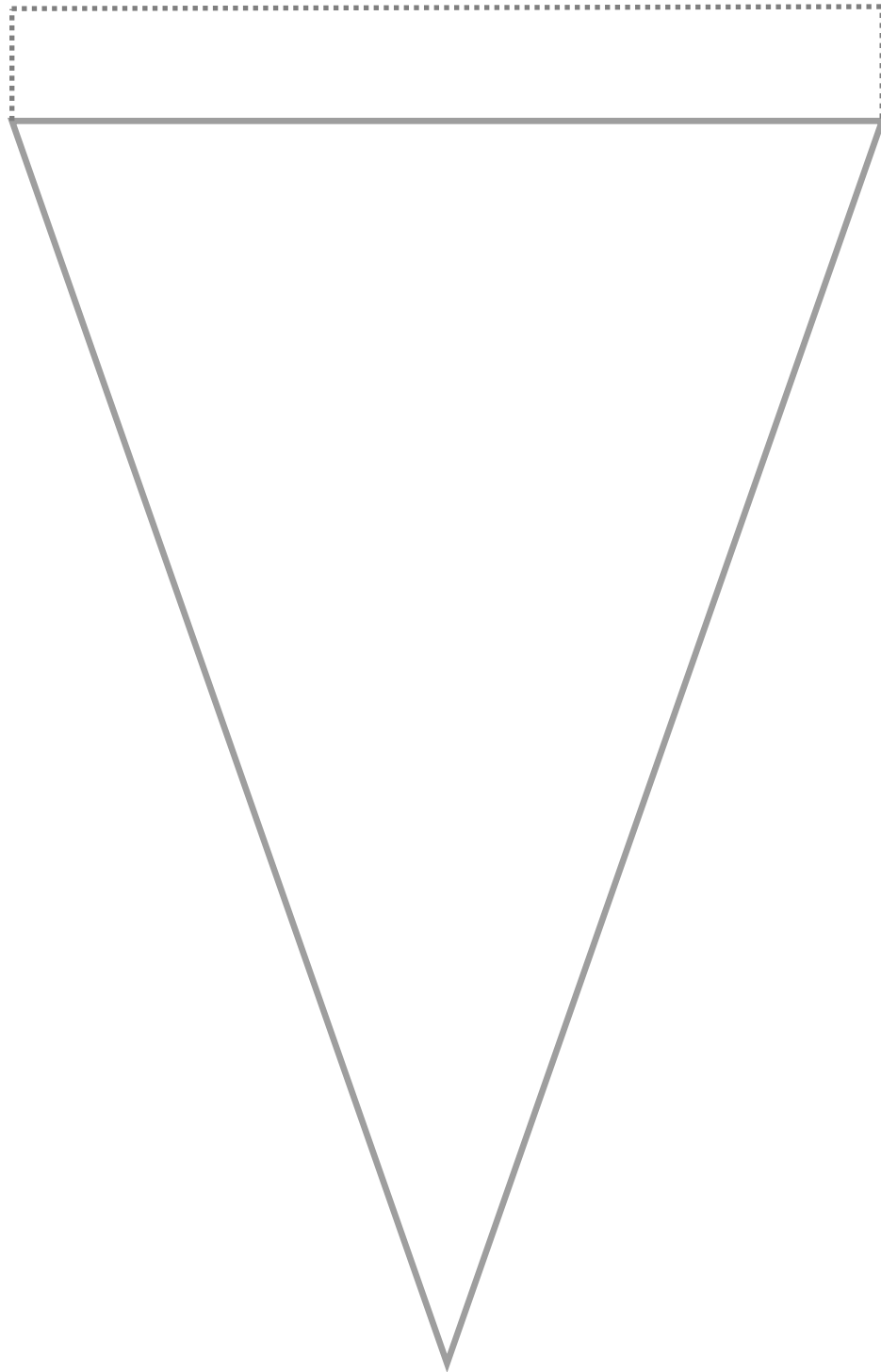
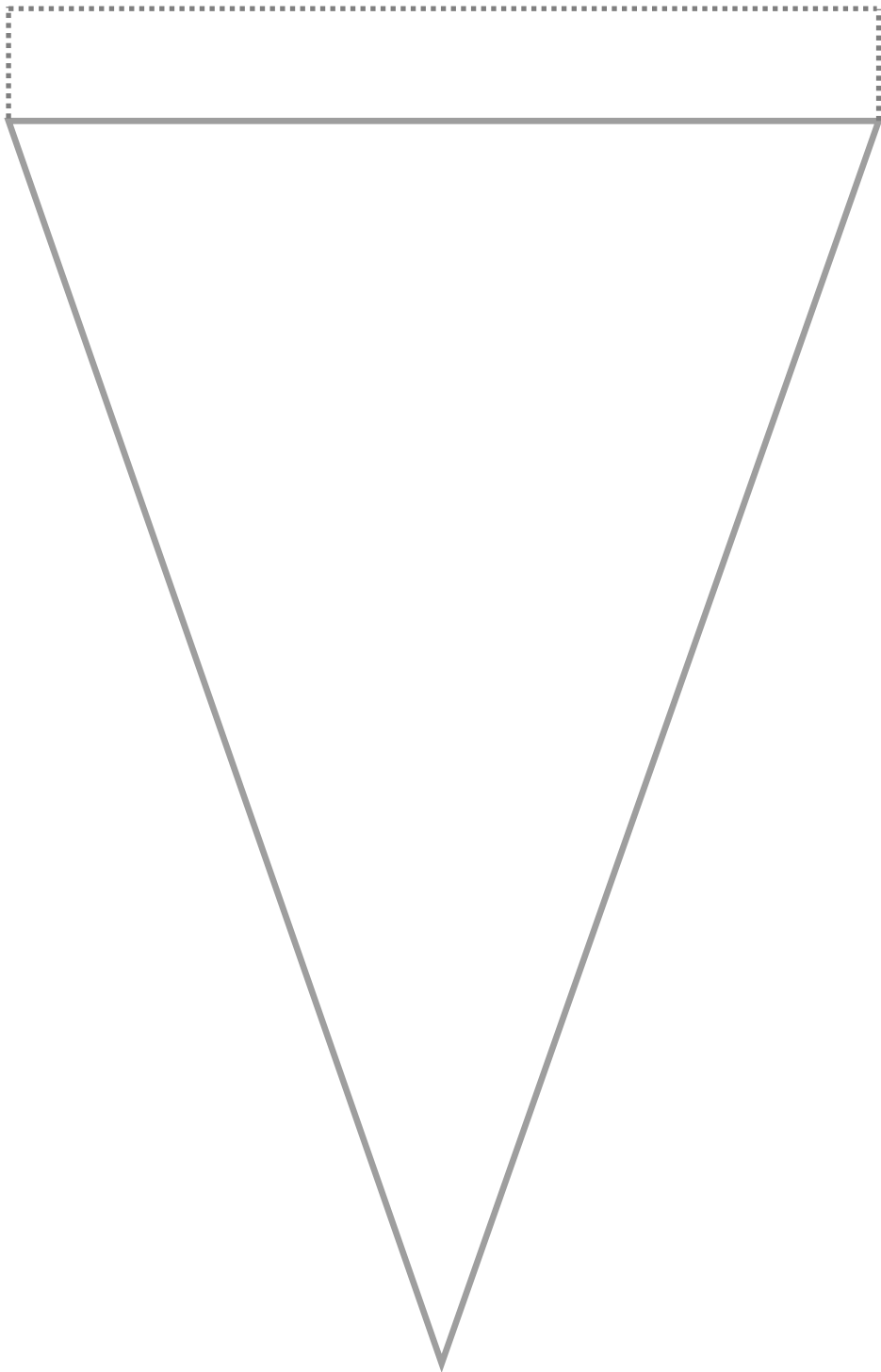


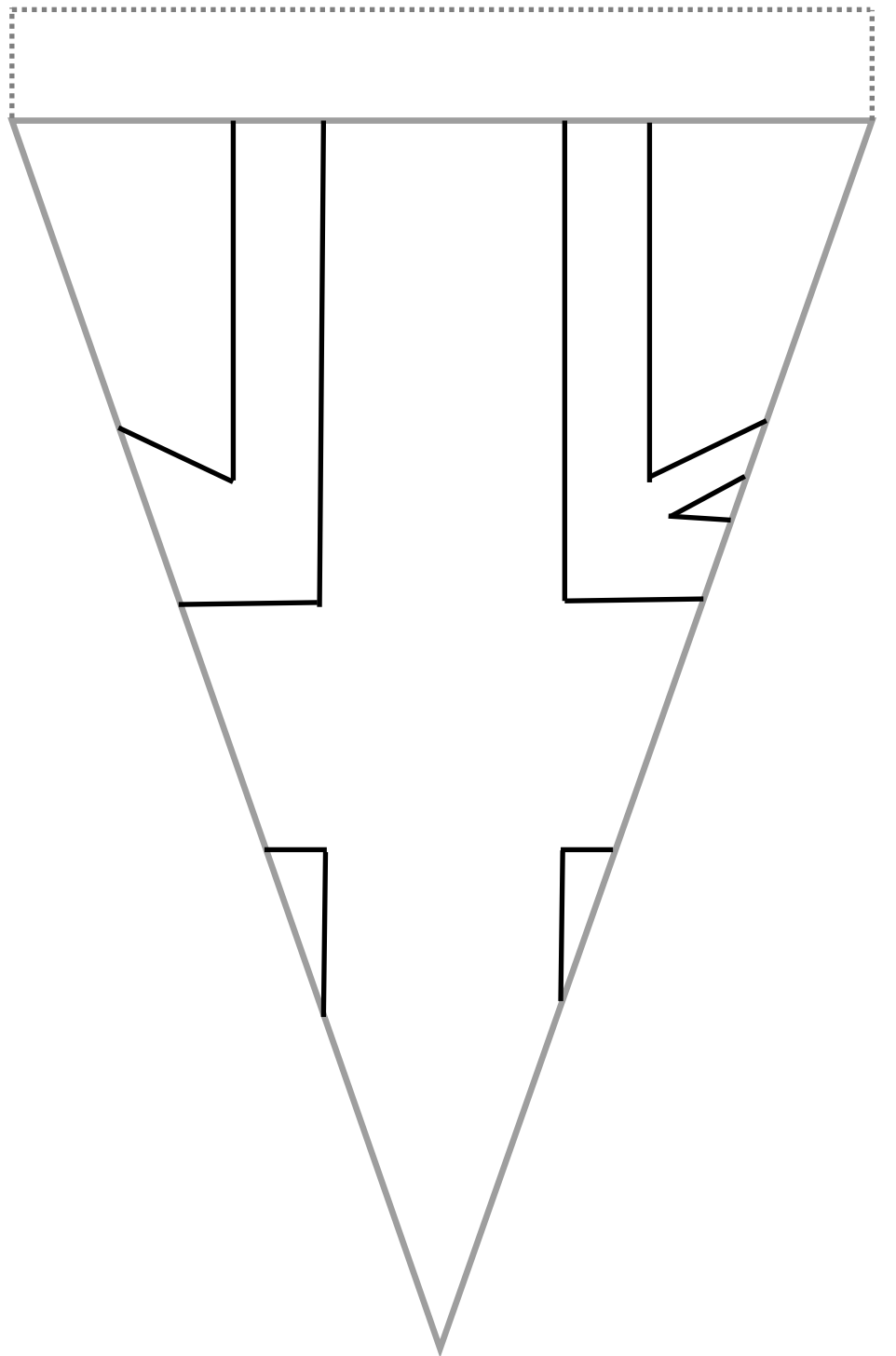
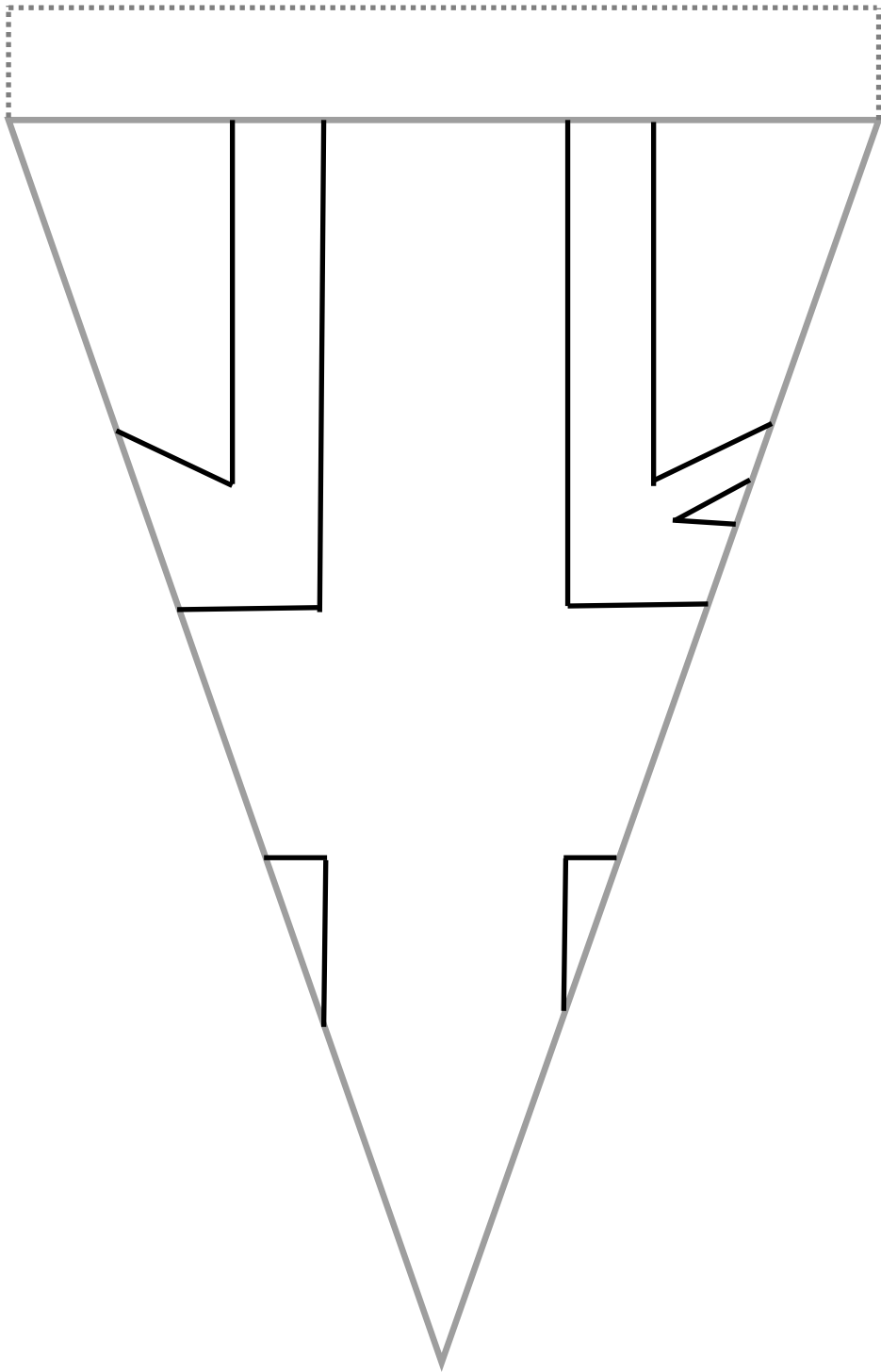
The Union flag is the national flag of the United Kingdom. It is often called the Union Jack, however it is only officially called the Union Jack when flown at sea. It is made up of the Cross of St George  (England), the Cross of St Andrew  (Scotland) and the Cross of St Patrick  (Ireland).

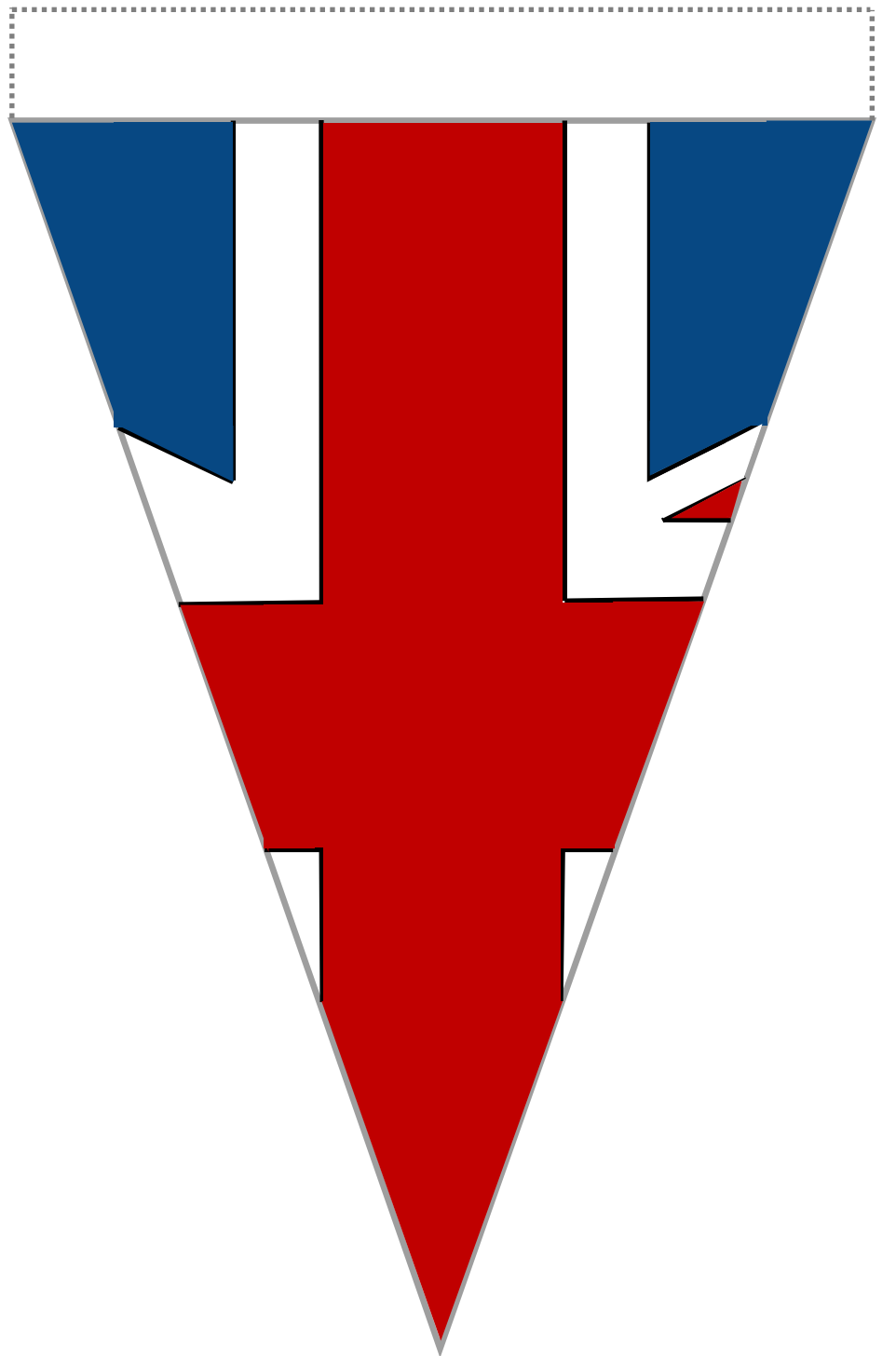
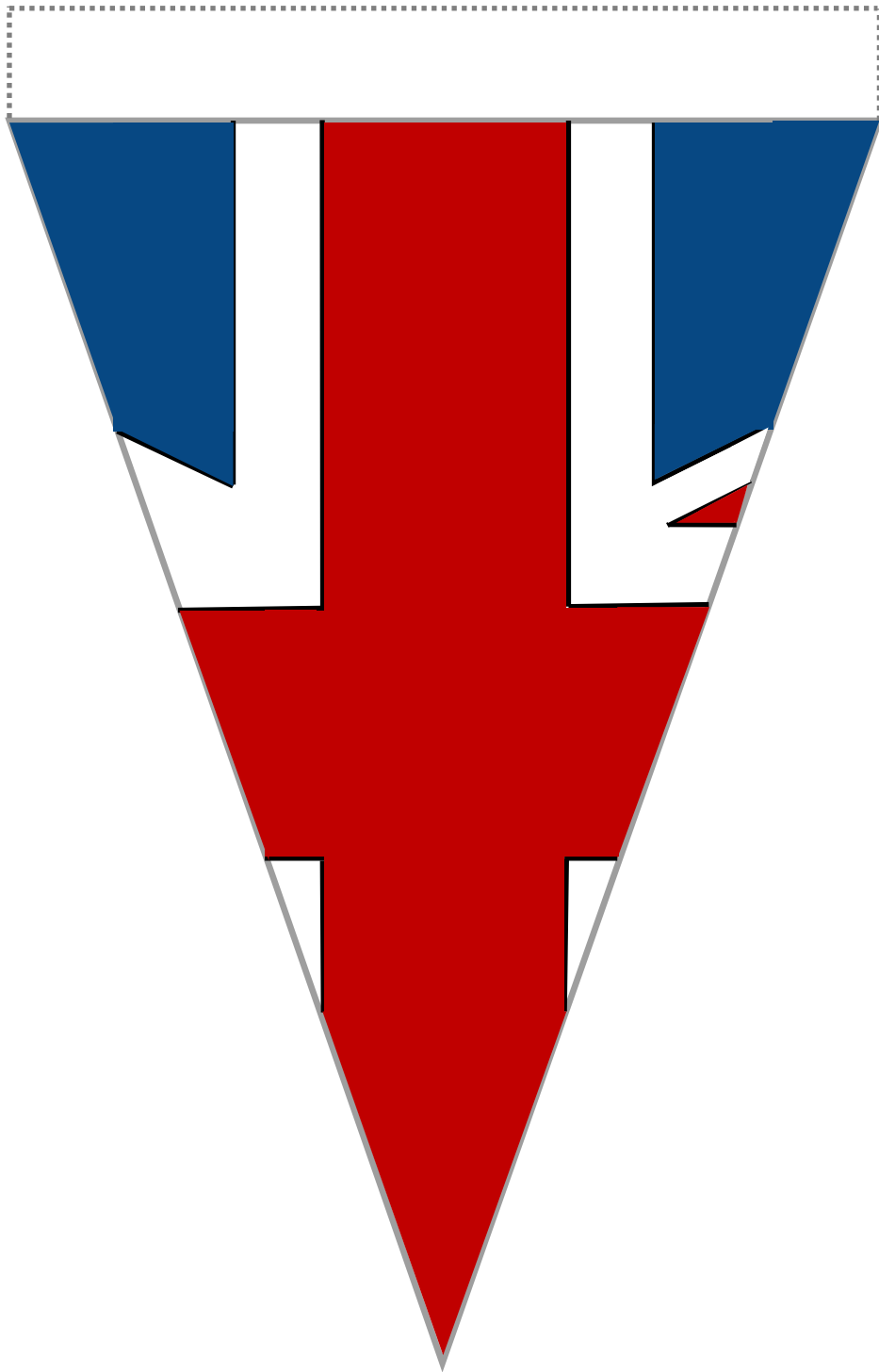
Choose the size and style of bunting you want to make. Print the pages you need and then design or colour in your flags. Cut out the triangles, with the dotted line strip along the top. Place your flags in a line a couple of centimetres apart face down. Lay a piece of string or wool along the top of the triangles and fold down the rectangular strip at the top of the triangle. Glue, tape or staple the rectangular strip over the string or wool. Repeat for all your flags. Display your completed bunting in your window to help everyone celebrate the 75th anniversary of VE Day.



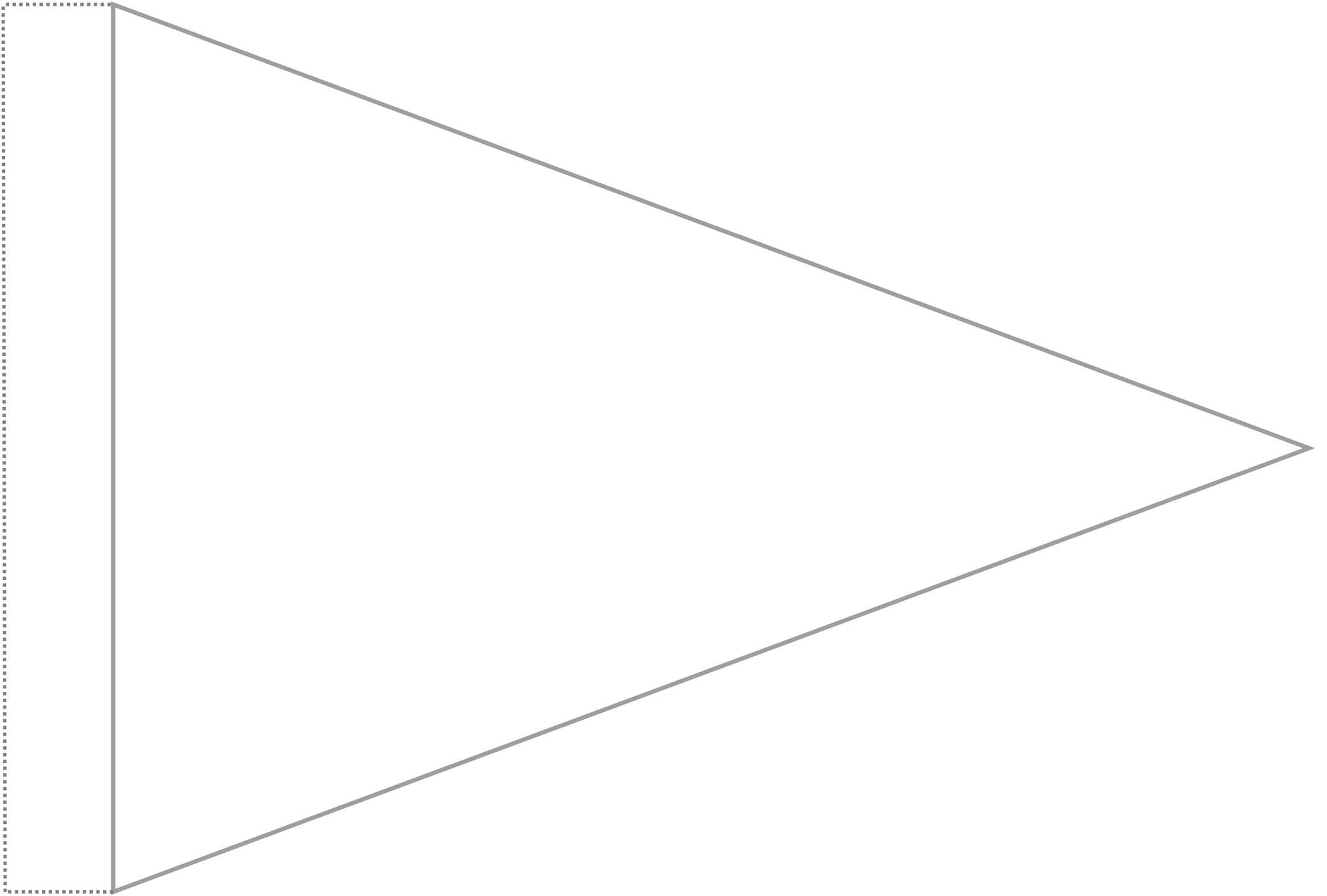
